







# STUDENT RANKINGS IN NATIONWIDE UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE EXAMS (2012–2019)




## **KOÇ UNIVERSITY LEADERSHIP IN EU HORIZON 2020 PROJECTS** (2014–2019)

This chart is produced based on funding amounts.




### KOÇ UNIVERSITY PHD STUDENT INTAKE




#### REWARDING TOP TALENT (2010)

# DISTRIBUTION OF ANATOLIAN SCHOLARSHIP STUDENTS (2011–2019)

After a thorough evaluation of 6.500 applications in 2019, a total of 107 eligible students were enrolled in the Anatolian Scholarship Program for the academic year 2019-2020. The program, which started out with 6 donors and 14 students in 2011, expanded to an outstanding capacity of 250 donors, old and new, and 606 scholar students, including both current students and graduates, in 2019. Today we continue to reach out to successful yet financially-disadvantaged young people across Turkey.



Our Anatolian Scholars come from all 81 cities in the country today. In 2019 applicants from 54 different cities were admitted as Anatolian Scholars.
